

But God intervened in a miraculously way and we were allowed to board the plane after the Turkish Airlines Supervisor came after us to inform us that he had made a phone call to Uganda and that it was Ok for us to board the plane because we could get the visa at our arrival in Uganda. Praise God!

We stayed four extra days in Kampala because our return flight was cancelled twice due to the bad weather in Istanbul. God was in control and he still is. His Word says that everything works for good for those that love the Lord.

We met wonderful people in Uganda and we were able to visit some churches, prisons, orphanages/schools and hold a conference in Kitgum where many pastors along with their wives and children attended.

This is a prison with a small population of juveniles. We had a great time ministering to these young men. There were 87 decisions for Christ and we were able to distribute Bibles, soap, rice and sugar. The prison staff were very grateful for our visit.

The men sang some Christian songs, and even though we couldn't understand their language, the Spirit of God allowed us to connect with them and joined them with their rhythm and clapping as they were singing.









They danced as they worship in a very African type style. I am sure God is pleased to see these souls worshipping him.












