Ministry Praise Reports

- Kairos Worship Night: Last fall we were able to gather at Mesa Church as a
 community of volunteers for a night of worship and prayer. Not only did this give our
 musicians an opportunity to knock the dust off their fingers and guitars, but it was a
 holy moment of sweet fellowship as we prayed for our community. We look to make
 this a biannual event. I'll be sure to make sure you get the invite for the next one!
- Eager to Rebuild: While volunteers were prohibited from entering the institution over the past two years, Jesus and his ministry was not hindered, for he nurtured and grew a remnant of the Body of Christ on all the yards. In the absence of religious program, a hunger grew within the institution to rebuild better. It's such a blessing to work with men (inmates) who are so invested in their walk of faith and in rebuilding the chapel programs.
- Gospel of John: During the lock out I've been making video recordings of a Bible study through the Gospel of John. While I have been putting these Bible studies on YouTube for the world to see, the main purpose of making these videos is to send them to the prison for the entire inmate population to see via their in-house TV network. To date, the first four videos have been sent to Donovan and should be airing sometime soon! Ministry Prayer Requests

- R.J. Donovan Chaplain Journey: Last fall I interviewed for the Protestant Chaplain position at RJD. This was a position I earnestly prayed for as I prayed "Thy will be done." In a disorienting blow, for the second time in my life, I was denied the position. That was a tough pill to swallow as I asked, "Lord, what are you doing?" In the months following the disappointment, I became frustrated as my professional life fell into limbo. Do I wait to apply for a potential second Protestant Chaplain position, or do I press forward working with the non-profit Pastors to Prisoners? For months I sought the Lord's guidance with no response...waiting...and waiting. Have you ever seen a movie where there is a big twist revealed at the end, like The Usual Suspects, where after the reveal is made they recap the entire movie in 30 seconds in light of the reveal and it all makes sense? Well, two weeks ago God gave me such a revelation about my life. In that glorious moment of clarity, He showed me how He had been protecting me from the chaplain position in order to more fully utilize my gifts within the institution as a Yard Pastor. All that said, I'm greatly looking forward to May, once I return from my honeymoon, to fully invest myself at Donovan and within the Pastors to Prisoners organization as a Yard Pastor!
- Prayer Walks: Throughout the pandemic, two practices were placed upon my heart: the desire to spend more time in prayer, and the need to do more workouts. As wedding preparation and planning began to consume, I found myself falling short with both desires. In a rare stroke of genius, I thought, "Why not combine them and nail two birds with one stone?" What a wonderful idea that was! Ever since then, my prayer walks have quickly become a cherished part of my weekly rhythm.
